



# California Air Resources Board (CARB) Phase 2 Compliance

**SCOPE: This assurance document covers all Stevens Industries, Inc., laminated and wood product lines.**

Stevens Industries, Inc., has taken an active role in assuring compliance to California Air Resources Board (CARB) regulations through our continued work with our composite panel suppliers.

We have verified that all of our Industrial Particleboard and Medium Density Fiberboard suppliers provide products that comply with Phase 2 requirements per the time line specified. While we use numerous domestic suppliers, all suppliers have verified that they are currently producing products that meet Phase 2 emission restrictions. They attest to compliance through their annotated invoices to Stevens.

January 1, 2011: Stevens Industries, Inc., is in compliance with CARB Phase 2. The emission level is at 0.09 parts per million (ppm) or less for the unlaminated particleboard cores and 0.11 parts per million (ppm) or less for medium density fiberboard (MDF) cores.

Stevens attests to CARB compliance through our annotated invoice to the customer.

At this update, Stevens is aware of the United States Environmental Protection Agency Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) Title VI Formaldehyde Standards implementation. Stevens will be in compliance and will closely monitor the rollout progress through 2017-2018 for required rule changes.

Special Note: CARB objective for reducing or eliminating formaldehyde is to control inputs to the product. Stevens adds another objective: To reduce or eliminate formaldehyde by earning the UL GREENGUARD Certification for our laminated and wood products. Products that earn GREENGUARD Certification are tested for volatile organic compounds (VOCs), including formaldehyde, and over 300 other VOCs with health-based limits.
